

What is a Recharge Center?

A recharge center is a unit within USC that provides fee-based technical or administrative services to the University's research community on a recurring basis.

What is a Specialized Service Center?

A specialized service center is a recharge center that is established to provide specialized services to a few users, such as animal care facilities, but they may also be used to provide commonly used goods or services, such as telecommunications centers or computer centers. A Specialized Service Facility usually provides services involving the use of complex or highly-specialized services.

How are recharge centers established?

To establish a recharge center, you must contact and receive approval from the Office of Financial Analysis (OFA) at 213-821-1937 or via email at <u>ofa@usc.edu</u>.

How to determine if your unit or department is eligible to set up a Recharge Center.

To qualify as a recharge center, the unit's goods and/or services:

- Must be provided on a regular basis.
- Must be in demand by multiple users.
- Must have a clearly identifiable cost that meets government requirements (i.e., no government unallowable costs may be included).
- Must have reasonably measured usage and billing rates. Recharge Centers must strive to "break even" and must adjust their rates on an annual basis to eliminate deficits or surpluses.

Can I charge different rates to grants?

Federal regulations require that Recharge Centers charge any grant customers the most favorable rate offered so grants and contracts do not subsidize other customers.
